STATEMENT OF CHARGES

**10 DAHMAR WARTTS-SMILES** 

Respondent.

12 On or around February 3, 2020, DAHMAR WARTTS-SMILES, a certified peace 13 officer with the University of Washington Police Department (UWPD), resigned in lieu 14 of termination from his employment with UWPD after: (1) knowingly making false and/or 15 misleading representations during an internal affairs investigation; and/or (2) engaging in conduct or a pattern of conduct that failed to meet the ethical and professional 16 standards required of a peace officer and/or disrupted, diminished or otherwise 17 18 jeopardized public trust or confidence in the law enforcement profession. Such 19 misconduct subjects WARTTS-SMILES's peace officer certification to discipline under 20 RCW 43.101.105(2)(d), (3)(j)(iv), and/or (3)(k). The circumstances are as follows:

## Count I

22 On or around August 4, 2019, and October 15, 2019, WARTTS-SMILES 23 knowingly made misleading, deceptive, untrue, or fraudulent representations in the 24 practice of being a peace officer. Specifically, WARTTS-SMILES made false and/or 25 misleading representations to his supervisor, Sergeant Michelle LaVetter, on or around 26 August 4, 2019, when he first reported that he had been arrested due to a domestic

violence altercation with his romantic partner that took place on or around August 3, 1 2 2019, in Las Vegas, Nevada. WARTTS-SMILES again made false and misleading statements about this domestic violence incident to investigators with the Tacoma 3 4 Police Department (TPD), who were assigned to conduct an internal affairs investigation on behalf of UWPD. WARTTS-SMILES's false and misleading representations 5 concerned the nature of the altercation, whether he physically touched his partner, the 6 cause of injuries to himself and his partner, and his characterization of his partner's 7 account of the incident. WARTTS-SMILES's statements to his supervisor and TPD 8 9 investigators were inconsistent with reports from hotel security staff and police officers 10 who responded to the scene, his partner's accounts, and his own prior statements. These false and misleading statements violated UWPD's policy governing truthfulness 11 (No. 26.1.1(D46)). After making these false and/or misleading representations, 12 13 WARTTS-SMILES separated from employment with UWPD on or around February 3, 2020. WARTTS-SMILES's peace officer certification is therefore subject to 14 mandatory revocation under RCW 43.101.105(2)(d). 15

## Count II

On or around August 4, 2019, and October 15, 2019, WARTTS-SMILES engaged in conduct that failed to meet the ethical and professional standards of a peace officer and/or jeopardized public trust in law enforcement when he engaged in the misconduct described in Count I. This misconduct subjects WARTTS-SMILES's peace officer certification to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv).

## Count III

25 On or around August 3, 2019, WARTTS-SMILES engaged in conduct that failed 26 to meet the ethical and professional standards of a peace officer and/or jeopardized

1	public trust in law enforcement when he: (1) engaged in a domestic violence altercation
2	with his romantic partner, resulting in him being arrested and booked in jail for the
3	criminal offense of domestic battery in the Clark County Detention Center; (2) failed to
4	timely report this incident to his supervisor in violation of UWPD policies; (3) made
5	disrespectful comments to and about hotel security staff and responding officers from
6	Las Vegas Police Department; and (4) consumed alcohol to the point of intoxication and
7	disruptive behavior. WARTTS-SMILES violated numerous UWPD Policies, including
8	No. 26.1.1(D2) (Unbecoming Conduct); No. 26.1.1(D4) (Conformance to Laws);
9	No. 26.1.1(D3) (Immoral Conduct); No. 41.4.2 (Response to Domestic Violence
10	Incidents Involving UWPD Employees and Law Enforcement Officers from Other
11	Agencies); and No. 26.1.1(D14) (Alcohol Use Off-Duty). This misconduct subjects
12	WARTT-SMILES's peace officer certification to discipline under
13	RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv).
14	AND/OR
15	Count IV

## Count IV

On or about February 3, 2020, WARTTS-SMILES resigned in lieu of termination 16 from his employment with UWPD after engaging in the misconduct described in 17 Counts I-IV. WARTTS-SMILES's peace officer certification is therefore subject to 18 discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(k). 19
