Such misconduct 17 OJEDA-LOPEZ's officer certification to peace 18 RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv) and (3)(k). The circumstances are as follows: 19 Count I 20 On or about August 17, 2020, OJEDA-LOPEZ engaged in conduct that failed to 21 meet the ethical and professional standards required of a peace officer and/or disrupted, 22 diminished, or otherwise jeopardized the public's trust and confidence in the law 23 enforcement profession. Specifically, on the above mentioned date, OJEDA-LOPEZ 24 became highly intoxicated while off-duty at a former SPD colleague's going away party, 25 and on two occasions in the same evening, assaulted her domestic partner by charging
