STATEMENT OF CHARGES

11 Respondent.

12 On or about September 12, 2019, Douglas A. Liddle, a certified peace officer
13 with the Anacortes Police Department, was discharged for disqualifying misconduct
14 pursuant to RCW 43.101.105(d), RCW 43.101.010(8)(a)(i)(B), and
15 RCW 43.101.010(8)(b). The disqualifying misconduct included conduct constituting a
16 crime committed under color of authority as a peace officer, to wit: Computer Trespass
17 in the First Degree and/or Official Misconduct. RCW 9A.90.040, RCW 9A.80.010. The
18 disqualifying misconduct is as follows:

19 **COUNT I**

20 Between the dates of September 2016 and June 2019, LIDDLE engaged in
21 conduct constituting the crime of Computer Trespass in the First Degree when he used
22 his position as a peace officer to intentionally gain access to, and conduct multiple
23 unauthorized queries in, an electronic database owned and maintained by a
24 government agency. RCW 9A.90.040.

25 AND/OR

COUNT II

Between the dates of September 2016 and June 2019, LIDDLE engaged in conduct constituting the crime of Official Misconduct when he used his position as a peace officer to intentionally gain access to, and conduct multiple unauthorized queries in, an electronic database owned and maintained by a government agency for his own personal benefit. In doing so, LIDDLE intentionally committed an unauthorized act under color of law. RCW 9A.80.010.

The discharge is final and some or all of the acts or omissions forming the basis for the discharge proceedings occurred on or after January 1, 2002. RCW 43.101.105(1)(d).
