SUBJECT: Advanced and Technical Collision Training

DATE: September 02, 2020

The Academy will be conducting three Advanced Collision Investigation courses and one Collision Reconstruction Collision Investigation course in 2021.

Advanced Collision Investigation

Session 1 April 26th – May 7th, 2021
Session 2 May 17th – May 28th, 2021
Session 3 June 7th – June 18th, 2021
Session 4 July 19th – July 30th, 2021

This is a required course for all graduates of Basic Collision Investigation. Attached is a list of personnel who are eligible to attend. Please schedule your personnel to attend with priority given to those with most seniority.

Names and lodging requirements should be submitted to your local eTrain administrator for registration, using course code **COL0100**. Once a trooper has been scheduled to attend, attendance is mandatory for the time scheduled (even if they transfer to a different district), unless other arrangements have been made with the Academy.

Classes will begin at 1 p.m. on the first day of training and conclude by 12 noon on the last day. An equipment list is at the conclusion of this IOC.

Technical Collision Investigation (CTS)

Tentatively scheduled for spring or fall of 2022

The prerequisite for this course is one year after successful completion of Advanced Collision Investigation, and command recommendation. Exceptions will be considered by the instructor on a case-by-case basis.

The prerequisite for this course is successful completion of Advanced Collision Investigation (or similar course), Technical Collision Investigation (or similar course), completing the CTS certification process, command recommendation and completing the pre-course readiness questionnaire. All candidates will be considered by the instructor(s) on a case-by-case basis.

Interested troopers should submit an IOC through their chain of command by June 28th, 2021. Participants will be selected by FOB, who will notify the Academy of selections by July 12th, 2021. District commanders and participants will then be notified by the Training Division to register the individuals for the course. Once notified, names and lodging requirements should be submitted to your local eTrain administrator for registration, using course code COL0050.

Students should report at 8am on the first day, and will be dismissed by 3 p.m. on the last day. An equipment list is at the conclusion of this IOC.

Equipment List:

Advanced

1. Note-taking materials
2. Scientific-type calculator (similar to Texas Instruments TI-30 III or TI-35) with sine, cosine, and tangent functions
3. Clipboard
4. Measuring tape (100- or 300-foot)

Technical and Reconstruction (in addition to Advanced equipment)

1. 360-degree protractor
2. Two 30-, 60-, 90-degree triangles
3. Equipment listed on the CTS equipment form

Classroom attire will be departmental uniforms or casual business attire, i.e. Dockers type trousers and polo shirts, will be worn during class. Field-type clothing (including rain gear) is recommended for outside practical exercises.

The training tank and gymnasium will be available for after-hours activities. Meal passes will be issued to those students in travel status; those not in travel status may purchase meal tickets.
