On or about March 4, 2023, while on duty as an SCDS corrections officer, HERRMANN engaged in conduct that failed to meet the ethical and professional standards required of a corrections officer and/or disrupted, diminished, or damaged the public's trust and confidence in the correctional system when he struck an inmate in the head while transporting the inmate in a wheelchair from one area of the Spokane County Jail to another area. HERRMANN'S misconduct resulted in criminal charges being filed against him by the Spokane County Prosecutor's Office on May 24, 2023 in
