Collision Investigation – Advanced

This 80 hour course expands upon concepts learned during Basic Collision Investigation, and introduces new material to aid in collision investigation cause analysis. Upon successful completion of this course, participants will be able to:

- Detail the Human, Vehicle, Environmental (HVE) model during pre-collision, collision, and post-collision analysis.
- Understand basics in articulated vehicle collisions, motorcycle collisions, and car vs. pedestrian collisions.
- Apply appropriate mathematical formulas in determining speed based on tire friction marks, critical speed scuffs, momentum analysis, vehicle vaults, and vehicle falls.

Applications should be submitted no later than four weeks prior to the class and are not a guarantee of acceptance into the class. Applications submitted within four weeks of a scheduled class may still be considered, after consult with WSP Instructors. Applications will be processed in a first come, first served basis. Those accepted into the class will receive an email notification four weeks prior to the course. Dorm Rooms may be available for students in travel status. If requesting a dorm room on WSP Campus, please indicate on your application.

Who can attend our classes?

Certified law enforcement officers that meet the pre-requisites, and prosecutors currently employed by a Washington State Prosecutors Office are eligible to attend class.
