A course for planning time-constrained missions at the patrol-level and more deliberate high-risk warrants, dignitary protection and large public events at the SWAT, Sergeant and Lieutenant-level.

Course Goals

- (1) Improve time and information management by utilizing time-tested formats that are easy to implement.
- (2) Increase officer safety by identifying, assessing, and mitigating risks.

Course Overview

Day 1: Time-Constrained Mission Planning

Planning Time: missions within 2 to 48 hours

Student-led teams will work through the Army's Time-constrained Leading Procedures to produce a one-page Concept of the Operation. Students will receive a class on how to give a military mission brief, then will brief their Concept of the Operation to the class. The last class of the day is how to run an "After Action Review".

Day 2: Deliberate Mission Planning

Planning Time—more than 48 hours to plan

Student-led teams will utilize the Army's more advanced Deliberate Decision Making Process in order to develop a multi-page Operations Order to plan high-risk arrests, large scale events, and missions requiring inter-agency coordination. Students will then brief their Operations Order to the class.
