- > Irrespective to the size or composition of the law enforcement agency, critical encounters between officers and the community can produce an irreparably negative affect. Students completing this course may employ the skills presented during active investigations to document and report these critical incidents. Transparent and thorough investigations will often reduce the criticism and distrust fostered by the community that results from officer-involved incidents.
