#### **Course Overview:**

Classroom instruction on considerations and tactics when responding to, supervising, and managing critical incidents. The supervisor's role in mitigating the risks to public safety, employees, and the liability to the organization will be explored in this course of instruction. Certificate of training issued upon completion of course.

Training consists of 2 days (16 hours) of instruction that will include, but is not limited to the following topics:

- Critical Incident types, scope, & tactics
- Decision making frameworks
- Site identification & reporting
- First responder REACT Team

#### **Instructor Bio:**

Wayne DuBois - Retired from law enforcement as an undersheriff with more than 27 years of law enforcement experience. Wayne was an active SWAT team member for over 20 years, as well as serving 5 years as a tactical and/or incident commander. During his career, Wayne has responded to, supervised, or been in command of hundreds of SWAT operations, including high risk warrant service, barricaded suspects, armed suicidal subjects, hostage situations and numerous vehicle take-downs, surveillance and take-away, and UC/CS rescue operations. Additionally, he was the supervisor of Street Crimes Unit for 5 years where he supervised numerous UC/CS Rescue Operations. Prior to law enforcement, Wayne served 4 years on active duty as a ground surveillance systems operator in the U.S. Army, including deployment to Southwest Asia for 6 months during Operation Desert Shield/Storm. Named SWAT Officer of the Year and Police Officer of the Year by the Benton County Sheriff's Office. Wayne serves as a Western Region Director for the National Tactical Officers Association (NTOA) and instructs in the NTOA's Command Cadre. He is a certified instructor in multiple disciplines, is a certified Force Science Analyst and Realistic De-Escalation Instructor, a certified emotional intelligence coach, and has had two published articles on SWAT procedures and operations in a national publication, "The Tactical Edge." Wayne holds a M.A. in Executive Leadership from Liberty University.
