The DUI Detection & SFST Course is a comprehensive impaired driver detection course. The three-day course is designed to increase the law enforcement officer's abilities to detect the impaired driver. This class is also a pre-requisite for attendance at an Advanced Roadside Impairment Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) class.

During this National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) approved SFST course, students will develop skills in recognizing, investigating and articulating their observations related to DUI enforcement, both in their written reports and verbal courtroom testimony. Additionally, students will learn to successfully identify and discuss typical clues of alcohol impairment that may be seen during the SFST's and how effective DUI enforcement acts as a deterrent to this violation.

On the final day of the course, a live alcohol workshop "wet lab" will be conducted to allow students the opportunity to apply their training on subjects who have been dosed with alcohol.

This class provides a great refresher or tune-up for your impaired driving investigations, especially if you haven't done any additional training since the academy.
