Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules: Revising [139-05-242](#) and [139-10-222](#) to clarify the eligibility and process for readmission and to implement additional restrictive measures for readmission into the academy after a dismissal due to a major rule violation. Removal of the 24-month suspension and replaced with 60-month for major violations.

Reasons supporting proposal: The rule change will require agencies who wish to hire a recruit previously removed from the academy due to any major violation to appeal to the executive director, or designee, for future reenrollment to the WSCJTC basic training academies. This process provides an added layer of accountability in making sure recruits are fit to attend the academy.
