STATEMENT OF CHARGES

Respondent.

On or about December 22, 2022, the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission (the Commission), received a complaint alleging that ERIN WILLEY, a certified peace officer currently employed by the Lewis County Sheriff’s Office (LCSO), engaged in conduct subjecting her peace officer certification to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3). The circumstances are as follows:

COUNT I

Between November 2016 and October 2017, WILLEY affiliated with one or more extremist organizations. Specifically, WILLEY knowingly or publicly wore items, symbols, costumes, insignias, and/or slogans associated with an affiliate group of the Proud Boys, an extremist organization as defined by WAC 139-01-310(14). Such misconduct subjects WILLEY’S peace officer certification to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(i).

COUNT II

Between November 2016 and July 2018, WILLEY engaged in conduct that failed to meet the ethical and professional standards required of a peace officer and disrupted, diminished, or otherwise jeopardized public trust or confidence in the law enforcement profession when she: (1) modeled, advertised, and sold apparel associated with the Proud Boys Girls, a Proud Boys affiliate group; and/or (2) filmed a Proud Boys initiation ritual involving the physical beating of her domestic partner at the time; and/or (3) failed to disclose her former affiliation with the Proud Boys and/or Proud Boys Girls to the Clark County Sheriff's Office, her employer from June 2017 to July 2018. Such misconduct subjects WILLEY'S peace officer certification to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv).
