**AMENDED STATEMENT OF  
CHARGES**

On or around June 17, 2022, MICHAEL BABINO, a deputy with the Asotin County Sheriff’s Office (ACSO), used force that could reasonably be expected to cause physical injury and that use of force violated policies of the ACSO and/or Washington law. BABINO’S conduct also failed to meet the ethical and professional standards of a peace officer and jeopardized public trust in law enforcement. Accordingly, BABINO’S peace officer certification is subject to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(e) and RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv). The circumstances are as follows:

**Count I**

On or around June 17, 2022, BABINO used an excessive amount of force while restraining a female inmate. This use of force could reasonably be expected to cause physical injury and violated the ACSO’s Use of Force and Deescalation policies and/or RCW 9A.36.041 (Assault in the Fourth Degree). BABINO’S peace officer certification is subject to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(e).

AND/OR

**Count II**

On or around June 17, 2022, BABINO engaged in conduct that failed to meet the ethical and professional standards required of a peace officer and jeopardized public trust in law enforcement when he used excessive force as described in Count I. BABINO'S peace officer certification is subject to discipline under RCW 43.101.105(3)(j)(iv).
